Rowe, Charles James, M.A., Trin. Coll., Camb., 1874, a member of the Northern circuit, a student of the Inner Temple 22 Nov., 1869 (then aged 21), called to the bar 7 June, 1873 (eldest son of Charles Rowe, Esq., of London); born , 1848; married 16 Nov., 1880, Anne, eldest dau. of George Gray, of Nareeb-Nareeb, Victoria, Australia.

Rowse, Henry Jenkin, M.A., Sidney Sussex Coll., Camb., 1879, a student of the Inner Temple 20 May, 1875 (then aged 22), called to the bar 3 July, 1878 (only son of Henry Jenkin Rowse, Esq., of St. Columb, Cornwall); born , 1853; married 11 Oct., 1881, Louie, younger dau. of Henry M. Sparnham, Esq., of the Warren, Forest Hill.

Rowsell, Francis William, C.B. 1879, C.M.G. 1880, British commissioner of ceded Daira lands, Egypt, since 1878, director of naval contracts admiralty 1873-8, entered admiralty 1855, a commissioner for inquiry relating to courts of justice 1873-4, to Government of Malta 1877-8, to post office supplies, and to London workhouse contracts, a student of the Middle Temple 15 Oct., 1859, called to the bar 11 June, 1862 (4th son of Samuel William Rowsell, of London); born , 1838; married 17 Nov., 1866, Harriette Emily, 2nd dau. of late William James Lancaster, Esq., of London.

Rowton, Lord (Montagu William Lowry-Corry), C.B., of Rowton Castle, Salop, so created 6 May, 1880, B.A., Trin. Coll., Camb., 1861, from Harrow, private secretary to Earl of Beaconsfield 1866-8, 1874-80, acting secretary Congress of Berlin 1878, D.L. Salop, C.B. 28 July, 1878, a student of Lincoln's Inn 21 Nov., 1860 (then aged 22), called to the bar 6 June, 1863 (2nd son of Rt. Hon. Henry Thomas Lowry-Corry, M.P.); born 8 Oct., 1838 (see Foster's *Peerage*).

Roxburgh, His Honour Judge Sir Francis, judge of county courts (circuit No. 33) since 1 July, 1881, recorder of Aldeburgh (Suffolk) since 1878, J.P. Suffolk, knighted 7 Dec., 1882, a student of the Middle Temple 29 Oct., 1842, called to the bar 7 Nov., 1845, admitted a barrister of Lincoln's Inn *ad eundem* 4 March, 1851, but with precedence of 12 June, 1849, Q.C. 15 Dec., 1866, bencher of the Middle Temple 30 Jan., 1867, treasurer 1882 (eldest son of Francis O. Roxburgh, Esq., of Haddington, N.B.); born , 1820; married 25 Dec., 1847, Mary, 2nd dau. of Rev. Henry Walker, of Great Bromley Hall, Essex; she died Dec., 1876.

Roxburgh, Francis, jun., B.A. 1873, LL.M. 1876, late scholar and law prizeman Trin. Hall, Camb. (from Harrow), author of *The Law and Practice under the Bankruptcy Act and Rules 1883*, *The Bankruptcy Act 1883 in the Form of an Alphabetical Index: and Marriage, its Legal Effect on Property*, 1879, a student of the Middle Temple 13 June, 1870, called to the bar 7 June, 1873 (only son of Sir Francis Roxburgh, Q.C., of the Middle Temple and of Lincoln's Inn); born ,
6, Pump Court, Temple, E.C.; Oxford and Cambridge Club, S.W.

Róy, Peary Lal, undergrad. Downing Coll., Camb., practises before the High Court at Calcutta, a student of the Inner Temple 10 Jan., 1877 (then aged 20), called to the bar 21 April, 1880 (3rd son of Raj Chunder Róy, of Lacotia House, Barisal, Bakurgunge, zemindar); born , 1857.
